Board of Governors Meeting

NINNESCAH SAILING ASSOCIATION
MINUTES OF THE BOARD OF GOVERNORS
AUGUST 4, 2005

Present: Allen Johnson, Alan Huffman, Jeff Gerken, Lori Graham, Jim Carlisle, Jim Honeyman, Patrick Adams, Neil Carlsen, Mary Kearbey, Rich Shull And Mark Reeves.

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 pm at the afterdeck patio. The power was out at the Afterdeck so the meeting was held in the twilight under threatening skies.

- The minutes of the July 7 meeting were approved as corrected. Shull advised that individual Yachting Club of America membership cards will be obtained for each member for use when visiting and seeking access to other affiliated yacht clubs.
- Allen Johnson distributed new member information to the board.
- Alan Huffman delivered the monthly financial statement from the accountants for John Curfman. It was approved subject to questions at the September meeting when John will be present.
- Lori Graham presented an award from the national Opti association to the club for it's excellent handling of the Opti regatta. It is on display in the Afterdeck. Jeff Gerken informed the board that the Boy Scouts have requested to camp at the club on the weekend of September 17 and are requesting a group of boats be available to take them sailing on one of the afternoons. He was directed to the PR committee and John Graves to make those arrangements.
- The Harbormaster Honeyman advised the work day of 7-30-05 was a success, and reminded members to move all extraneous material and items from the slips. There should not be anything left on the docks except dock boxes and garden hoses. He discussed the need to replace C slip, (see discussion below).
- Pat Adams Thanked all the members who worked countless hours to clean the area after the 7-3-5 storms. He advised the park staff came in ahead of some of their other work to pick up debris so the club was in good order for the Catalina 25 nationals the next weekend. He replaced missing foam blocks under A slip and did a thorough evaluation of the damage to C slip which he discussed with the board at the informal meeting on July 20. A roofer has been contacted to replace several missing shingles. The pump out station was damaged by lightning and has been repaired. The fence around it still needs to be repaired. Some repairs have been made to all the slips as a result of the storm. A few minor repairs will be needed to the club boats. He advised the two old inflatable jet skis were inoperable and parts are no longer available. The board authorized the sale of those. The youth boats were



washed down with a bleach solution when they returned from a regatta at Lake El Dorado. He thanked all who have helped keep the club in operation this season.

- Alan Huffman advised the Jobson presentation would be in the Bank of America (Bank IV) theater at Broadway and Douglas on November 4, 2005. The board authorized tickets to be \$15.00 in advance and \$20.00 at the door.
- Neil Carlsen thanked all the members for the many hours spent cleaning up after the storm. He reminded members to not deposit used oil, chemicals or batteries at the club, to lock the gates and mow their yard spaces.
- Mary Kearbey reported that the youth sailing camp was a success and that the afterdeck was being used regularly.
- Kevin Findley, who couldn't be present, delivered a written report on the successful regattas and racing season. He thanked all persons who assisted in making this an outstanding season. He reminded everyone that the C.O.R.N. Regatta will be September 3 and 4. The classes invited are the Sunfish, Lasers, San Juan 21's and Prindle 15's.
- Jim Carlisle informed the board that Andy Woodward was bringing an adjuster to the club to evaluate C slip. One bid for \$150,000.00 had been received and another was being sought for C slip replacement. He said funding issues were being investigated and that the long range planning committee had started its review of long-term financial issues to assist the board in the impending decision on the replacement of C slip. Once the cost of replacement in excess of any insurance proceeds is known, funding will be sought and the board can make a final decision. Jim reported that there were 41 new members at the new member reception. The board authorized giving Heather \$50.00 so she could replace the initiation props, which disappeared after last year's ceremony. The board also authorized a \$50.00 gift certificate to the ship's store to be auctioned off at the August 20 fundraiser for the Thorp Memorial Fund.
- Mark Reeves advised a payment needed to be made to the Post Office to refresh the postage for the Mainsheet.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:15. It was raining and the lights came back on at 8:17.

The September board meeting will be at the Afterdeck on Thursday the 1st at 7:00 pm. The regular monthly board breakfast will be at 7:00 am at the Beacon Restaurant on E. Douglas on August 16.

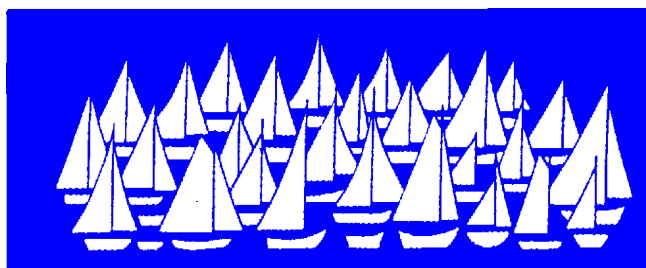

* **E-mail MAINSHEET**

Remember, the E-mail issue of the *MAINSHEET* usually arrives at your computer on the Tuesday following the Thursday BOG meeting. * **Harbormaster**

Be sure to run electrical wires on the docks under the decking and to keep garden hoses rolled up to reduce tripping hazard. Remove plants growing in the slips.

* **Yardmaster**

Tie down small boats and trailers in the boatyards. Make sure your name is on your trailer. Do not leave old motor oil or worn out batteries in the yards or sheds. You must dispose of these items. Mow your yard space or it will be mowed by the club and the member will be charged at the rates: Empty Yard Space - \$32.00; Unobstructed Yard Space - \$47.00; Obstructed Yard Space - \$78.00

* **Pest Control**

Anyone interested in having a professional pest control service for their boat should contact Patrick at the lake.

RULES

The regatta shall be governed by the 2005-2008 International Sailing Federation (ISAF), Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS), the prescription of the United States Sailing Association (US Sailing), and local appendixes. A boat entering as a member of a one-design class shall conform to class rules.

YOUR HELP IS NEEDED: All boaters need to be made aware of the zebra mussel infestation and spread into Midwest area lakes, and work to ensure that we are not part of the problem. Cheney Reservoir is currently free of zebra mussels. To prevent the spread of zebra mussels a 5-day drying period for your boat is recommended. If that is not possible, a solution of bleach and water (10% bleach) applied to the mussels should kill them on contact.
