

## Board of Governors

### MINUTES OF 4-6-06 MEETING NINNESCAH SAILING ASSOCIATION BOARD OF GOVERNORS

Present: Carlisle, Carlsen, Honeyman, Mason, Shull, Gerken, Adams, Huffman, Johnson, Graves and Fitzgerald.

- The Commodore called the meeting to order at 7:02 pm.  
- The minutes of the March meeting were approved as published.

- Allen Johnson reported that the membership cards, decals and second half dues notices had been mailed. He also reported that two military members had been relocated and consequently dropped their memberships.

- He presented the Board with a request for a transfer of a slip with a boat sale from David Neville to Ed Edwards. The board approved the transfer.

- John Graves presented the financial report, which was discussed and accepted.

- Pat Adams presented an extensive report on his activities. Repairs have been made around the club including the crane hydraulic ram. See Pat's full report elsewhere in the mainsheet.

- He announced **orientation classes** would be held on **Sunday April 23** as follows: **11:00 am club boats, 12:00 noon Afterdeck, 1:00 pm crane.**

- Neil Carlsen announced the following **club workdays** for the season: **April 29, May 20, June 24 and August 26.**

- He also reminded members to make sure their trailers are in good shape in case they should need to be moved quickly in the event of a grass fire. He also requests everyone to put their name on their trailer.

- Jim Honeyman advised that work would commence on replacing some flotation as needed on the slips and waterproofing efforts would also begin soon.

- Mike Mason reported that the Casino Night party was a great success and more than \$3200.00 was raised for the deck expansion project. Work has commenced on the deck expansion and completion is anticipated by mid June.

- He reminded everyone of the **cookout** scheduled for **April 8** and requested that any funds raised at the cookout in excess of the expenses be applied to the deck expansion. The board approved that request.

- Mike said the yearbook was being completed and ads therein needed to be in his hands by April 30.

- The board discussed yearbook and *MAINSHEET* advertising policies and decided to table the matter for future discussion and possible action.

- Jeff Gerken asked the board for a policy on the use of the coach boat for out of town regattas. The discussion expanded to the use of all youth boats for out of town regattas. The board approved the use of the coach boat for the upcoming CSSA regatta and requested Jeff bring a proposed policy on youth and coach boat use for discussion at the May meeting.

- The board approved the use of an available unoccupied slip for storage of the youth Catalina 22.

- Jeff advised there would be **boating safety classes** held at **Cheney Marina on April 29 and September 4.**

- Jim Carlisle presented the Arthur B. Hanson Rescue Medal, which finally arrived, to Pat Adams.

- Alan Huffman thanked Patrick and Terry for their participation in the KDWP legislative luncheon at the Capitol in March.

- The Board discussed the recent request from the Reno County Tax assessor for a list of boat numbers to check against the list sent them from KDWP in Pratt. After much discussion, the board decided to send our boat number list with the caveat that the club could not confirm which boats were on the premises Jan 1, 2006. Members who receive a tax notice from Reno County for a boat taxed elsewhere should contact the assessor to make the correction.

- The board determined that written lease agreements should be considered for member signature on the yard spaces and slips containing appropriate terms allowing the board to deal with abandoned boats. The matter will be taken up at a future meeting.

- The **BOG monthly breakfast** is scheduled for **April 18** at 7:00 am at the Beacon.

- The next **BOG meeting** will be **May 4** at the **Afterdeck** at 7:00 pm.

- The meeting was adjourned at 9:50



## BOATER SAFETY EDUCATION COURSE


A Boater Education Safety Course will be taught at Cheney Boat House located at the East Side Marina on April 29 from 9 to 4.

**THIS CLASS WOULD BE HELPFUL FOR ANYONE WHO OWNS A BOAT, and is a REQUIREMENT for anyone born after January 1, 1989.** For reservations call Dennis Zehr at 838-4574.

Kansas Laws states:

"Any person born on or after January 1, 1989 must complete an approved boater safety education course in order to operate a motorboat or sailboat on public waters in Kansas. This requirement does not apply to a person under the direct supervision of a person over 17 years of age who either possesses a certificate of completion of an approved boater safety education course, or is legally exempt from the requirement. Boating safety courses that are approved by the National Association of State Boating Law Administrators (NASBLA) and recognized by the United States Coast Guard meet these educational requirements. Nonresidents who boat in Kansas must comply with the education requirements. All states provide a NASBLA approved course which meets Kansas boater education requirements."

A free home study course is also available by calling Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks at (620) 672-5911 ext. 170. The Kansas Boater Safety Course is available on Internet at [www.boat-ed.com](http://www.boat-ed.com) for a \$15 fee.

# Property Manager Summary: March 2006

**Yards:** - Contractor replaced all bad electrical receptacles in both yards. All working now.

- Cheney Electric repaired underground water leak in the west yard. Cost was reduced due to do-over from last time it failed.

- Ark Valley Electric set two new poles in the East yard for new security lights. Also excavated sites for new parking lot lites south of Afterdeck.

**Landscape:** - Took delivery of repaired and repainted sign boards to be re-mounted around Small Cove and Beach areas. Posts need to be re-stained and boards re-attached to let motor-craft and fishermen know of restrictions.

- Received two saplings for transplanting from Richard Abbott. Thank you.

**Club Boats:** - Commissioned Zodiac safety boat for some early season practice by Youth Sailors. Will commission committee boat, Lund, and work barge soon. Inventoried all club-owned boats with John Graves.

**Slips:** - Wintertime bird droppings need to be pressure washed off all docks including Small Cove, then deck sealant needs to be applied. Volunteers welcome. Pumpout dock to be moved into summer position soon. Pumpout trailer is being repaired by State.

- Slip Water system to be commissioned April 7. Barring any wintertime damage, should be operational by that weekend.

- Crane was discovered out of commission on April Fool's Day. Hydraulic cylinder push rod had snapped. Apparently has been damaged over the years by compression during wind storms. I removed the cylinder, and took it to the original manufacturer (16 years ago). They informed me that it was out of warranty, but replaced the push rod, re-sealed the cylinder and returned it to me in three days. With Rich Schull's help, re-installed it six days after it was found to be broken. Total repair costs: about 300 bucks. Estimated commercial repair cost: in excess of \$1000.

**Afterdeck:** - Blown-off shingles replaced again. Shingles have blown off 3 times in the past year, including July 3<sup>rd</sup> storm. Asphalt shingles are rated for 20 years, and may be showing their age. Club should plan on replacing sometime before 2019.

- Building's outside water hydrants were turned back on.

- Wi-Fi: Additional outside distribution antenna to be installed soon which will extend service into slip area. More antennas will be installed as needed. Service is available in and around Afterdeck building now.

**Thorp Deck Expansion:** Attended meetings regarding fundraising and construction. My efforts included procurement of steel for concrete foundations, thank you to Jim Carlisle for his help. Contracted fabrication of structural steel pieces on Allan Johnson's design with Doug Vieth, (Doug the Welder). He completed very quickly and I delivered the pieces to a company in Salina for galvanizing. Picked up and returned them to the Afterdeck ready for installation. Ordered nuts, bolts, washers and lags for deck structure. Contracted concrete work for foundations, work started April 1 with cutting existing slab sites for excavation soon.

- While using the portable pressure washer to hose off the slab last Monday, our unit failed. To Recap: After borrowing the unit frequently from a member the last couple of years, the Club purchased it for \$400. It has been used for deck cleaning on the slips and Afterdeck, patio cleaning, Shelterhouse cleaning, PM Residence cleaning (outside), Bathhouse cleaning, and storm cleanup. Volunteer Terri Cramer used it to clean concrete residue form the Afterdeck patio for a couple of hours, and then the pump failed. Replacement seals and gaskets are not immediately available. A slightly larger and better rebuilt pump was fitted to the engine for \$200 plus two hours labor. So now we have a better used unit with a rebuilt pump for total \$750. Old unit sold for about \$650 new on sale.

**PM Residence:** - Blown off Shingles replaced. Guttering on one side of house found to have been improperly installed by original contractor, causing leakage, so it was re-mounted. Original contractor not to be found.


- Fireworks contractor called me about this year's show on Labor Day. Will arrange for the best show we can get on this year's reduced budget.


