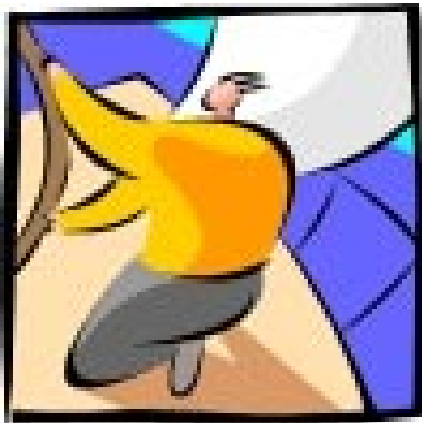

Board of Governors

Minutes

August 3, 2006

Present: Fitzgerald, Carlisle, Honeyman, Adams, Huffman, Shull, Carlsen, Mason and Woodward.

- Meeting called to order at 7:05 pm by Commodore Huffman.
- The Minutes were approved as published.
- The financial report was received and filed with questions and discussion reserved for the September meeting when Graves will be present.
- Woodward discussed insurance coverage options for future consideration.
- Honeyman advised that the end braces would be removed from C dock to allow it to float properly in anticipated low water conditions. He reminded members to monitor slip and cove depth as the water depth will continue to go down in these weather conditions.
- Adams reported that engine work had been done on the committee boat and that the Lund was on its trailer because the low water depth in the slip assigned to it, and it would be launched as needed. The Kabota tractor is in the shop for maintenance.
- Bill Raymond donated a portable generator, leaf blower and chain saw to the club.
- Allen Hale has loaned a utility trailer to the club on a long-term basis. He advised the board that he was investigating the cost of redecking A and B docks.



- Patrick reminds members who use the Afterdeck to **please turn off the lights, air conditioner and lock the doors** when they are done.

- The board discussed the eventual need to replace the committee boat due to its age and condition and the options available for increasing storage yard size to accommodate more boats and trailers and possibly members R.V.s.

- Mason reminded members of the upcoming Labor Day event in September and the Low Country Boil in October. He advised members who left BBQ utensils in the Afterdeck after last month's party that they are in the kitchen area for retrieval.

- Carlsen reminded members to mow yard spaces and to not leave used batteries or oil on the premises and to lock the yard gates if they are last to leave.

- Carlisle discussed the September 8 National State Park Directors event and the need to arrange a cooker for the anticipated 300 steaks KDWP was providing. He and Adams reminded the members that the KDWP will be setting up several vendor tents for the event and would be occupying various parts of the club that entire day.

- Huffman reviewed the long range planning committee's discussion of future slip expansion. He advised he was still working on a proposed slip lease agreement and abandoned boat issues with Jeff Leonard.

- The September board meeting will be at the Afterdeck September 7 at 7:00 pm.

- The monthly board breakfast will be at the Beacon on August 15 at 7:00 am.

Meeting adjourned at 8:35 pm.
