August and the beginning of September have been busy at the Club. In just 3 weeks, we've had the Poker Run, another KBRS night race, the Commodores Breakfast, CORN Regatta, New Member initiation, Labor Day Dinner and Fireworks. Congratulations to all of the many players that make all these great events happen.

Once again, a sincere "thank you" and a round of applause is appropriate for the Social Chairmen, Social Committee, and Operations Officer that made the labor Day Pig Roast another great success. These people are the "Energizer Bunnies". Again, roughly 350 people were in attendance and were fed in 30-40 minutes, and changes to the way that the food was served insured that nobody missed out on the meats. With the CORN Regatta taking place Labor Day weekend, we also showed the out-of-towners what a great group we have. I received several responses from people who had not been here before, about what a great place this is and how well they were treated.

We are continuing to help the Friends of Cheney Lake (FOCL) to promote the fundraising needed to secure and install a near real time weather station on the end of our jetty with data passed through the club's website. When complete, you and the general public can view current weather from your home computer or even your internet capable cell phone. The FOCL has collected about two-thirds of the funds needed to complete the project. At this point, the NSA Board approved the design and implementation plan and authorized the purchase and implementation of the basic hardware. Until the fundraising is complete the equipment and software needed for data capture and uplink to the web site will not be able to be purchased and implemented. We'll be able to see the real time data at the Afterdeck but not beyond until additional funding is collected. So, send your tax deductible contributions to: the "Friends of Cheney Lake" C/O Gregg Greenwood, 1239 Denmark, Wichita, KS 67212 and indicate that you are contributing to the weather station project. Do it today so the project can continue uninterrupted to its full capability.

Our thanks goes out to Stan Chase for all the time and talent he's put in to specifying and evaluating alternatives for the weather station. Let him know you appreciate his service to the club.

I'm sure you have read in the paper that we now have Zebra Mussels in Cheney. It was only a matter of time with boats transporting bilge water from place to place without taking needed precautions. But, we can help to further prevent the spread. See the notice, located in this Mainsheet, from Wildlife and Parks discussing the issue and prevention steps we can take and be prepared for any through hulls and underwater appendages to be covered with the little critters.

We had a great turnout of Thistles from the Kansas City and Tulsa areas at the CORN Regatta. To my knowledge, this was the first time the Thistle fleet was invited to participate. I had the pleasure of crewing on one. The Thistle is an amazingly fast three person boat that hardly takes any wind to propel. Some interest was sparked in having some local boats (a new local one-design fleet). Thanks to Tim Fitzgerald and Larry Bigus from the Kansas Sailing Assn. at Lake Clinton for pushing their participation and getting the boats and crews committed to come here for the event. CORN is returning to its former status as a premier one-design event in this region that should not be missed. We look forward to having the Thistle's participate next year and perhaps helping them to host a regional or larger event in conjunction with the CORN regatta.

I also had the pleasure of crewing on a "big boat" in the KBRS night race. There is another night race planned in September. So, if you haven't done it, come out. It's great fun, no official points involved and no pressure.

Flipping of the boards on the main walkways of the slips is progressing but the Harbormaster still needs assistance. If you are a wet slip committee member or just want to volunteer to help, please contact Jim Honeyman. He's planning weekends in September and October to get as much of this done as is possible. If we can't get this project done with club members before year end, we plan to hire the work out next year. To pay for that work, we expect that we will use the funds we will receive from not giving work credit to those that didn't complete their required hours and those who are not eligible for the program next year as a result. We of course, would rather see the club get the necessary work done internally. If you can help, contact Jim.

Minutes for September 6, 2007

Board members present: Fitzgerald, Woodward, Huffman, Carlsen, Pierce, Honeyman, Garvey

- Commodore Fitzgerald convened the meeting at 7:00 pm

- The minutes for the August Board meetings were approved as published.

- Fitzgerald responded to questions from the guest members about the resolution of an altercation between two members that occurred in August.

- Adams reported that the wet slip lights and photo cells were installed. The crane was inspected by a professional inspection company because of a boat crashing into it earlier this season. No previously unknown problems were found to be caused by the crash. There is however an old repair that is not up to code which will require correction. The crane was judged to be in remarkable condition. Pedestrian lights were replaced and there are more to do. Grass was seeded around the Snyder Memorial. Lights were repaired at the Shelter House and a picnic table that apparently was submerged for the benefit of a fisherman or boaters was retrieved onto shore. The grounds were fogged for bugs before the Labor Day dinner. Committee boats had horns repaired, water pumped out and a bumper installed on the pontoon boat. The hydro hoist was repaired. Roger Gibson, Gary Sheppard, and Patrick Adams repaired several dining tables in preparation for the Labor Day dinner. In the Afterdeck kitchen, under-counter lighting donated by Sonly was installed by Patrick. Big appreciation to all for making the ice machine a big success!!

- Friends of Cheney association have 2 big projects under way: The Arboretum, to replace the trees at NSA started with seed money of \$3600, now up to \$6000. The first trees under this program will be transplanted in September with drip irrigation. The Cheney Weather Station Project is collecting funds and a detailed implementation proposal was presented by Stan Chase. Huffman moved to proceed on the project with full capability being subject to raising the balance of the required funds. Pierce seconded the motion, with unanimous approval by the Board.

- Graves presented the financial reports for August which were discussed and approved.

- Carlsen reported that plaques will be installed on benches for the Wayne Snyder memorial.

- There will be another workday on 9/22/07 to work on the grounds. Workers on other committees must have their committee chairman send an okay to Neil Carlsen in order to get work credit. Work remaining to be done this year includes pouring a sidewalk on the side of the Afterdeck and a waterway into Sailboat Cove. Make sure to put your names on your trailers.

- Honeyman reported that 4 buoys have been cleaned. Four more sections on A dock had their boards flipped. Work will continue for the next 3 weekends on this effort for A and B Docks. Other remaining work includes re-installing end caps on C dock which are still in the hands of the welder. The "Sailboats Only" buoys will be pulled weekend of 9/15. Honeyman will see if divers from the Cheney Fire Dept can be used to look for missing moorings.

- Garvey reported on the successes of the past two social events held in August. The Poker Run and Pizza Party event on Aug 11 had about 100 participants, great weather and a lot of fun. The fabulous Pig Roast dinner on Labor Day weekend was enjoyed by over 300 people with rave reviews from all, followed by a spectacular fireworks display. One more social event this season, the Low Country Boil and Bonfire, will be held in October.

- Pierce reported on the Big Success of the CORN Regatta, which has resumed its position as a Premiere event of the season. There were really good groups of boats participating and the help from the Social Committee really helped the Regatta be successful, a trend he's wanting to keep going into the future. Jr. Sailing was a good success this season with 23 kids in the last camp. The GUST program was also a big success.

- Huffman reported that there are two scheduled rentals of the Afterdeck. The Long Range Planning committee will be present at the next meeting to present recommendations.

- Woodward reminds all Committee Chairmen to have their work credit turned in by Oct 15th. The Fire Alarm in the Afterdeck will be turned on by early next month. The phone service is being re-bid and Graves will participate in that discussion.

- Graves reported that all is complete on NEST except for issuing stock certificates.

- The number of Mainsheets to be mailed continues to go down, reducing costs.

- Pierce will finalize Jr. Boat Usage policy and send to BOG for review.

- The Moorings task force will develop a proposal on rate changes based on water depth and to impose a new day use/overnight fee similar to the camp sites.

- The BOG will develop a privacy policy to govern the use of member information.

- Paid advertising in the Mainsheet was discussed. Garvey will prepare a proposal for rates to be charged. Effective immediately, non-member classified ads will be charged \$25 per month, to be paid in advance.

- A bill covering improvements to lakes and waterways is going to the federal Congress in September. This bill has no content related to Cheney Lake. Huffman will contact Tiahr to see if it is possible to get an amendment to cover Cheney Lake enhancements.

- Membership resignation letter from Scott Dozier was received, accepted and filed.

- Next BOG on Oct 4, 7 pm, Quincy's

- Long Range Planning committee date and time to be announced.

- Meeting adjourned at 10:30 pm.



ZEBRA MUSSELS FOUND IN CHENEY RESERVOIR; ALL LAKE USERS MUST TAKE PRECAUTIONS

Wildlife and Parks is working with stakeholders to contain infestation; lake-user help is essential.

WICHITA— The Kansas Department of Wildlife and Parks (KDWP) has confirmed that zebra mussels have been found in Cheney Reservoir. During routine lake inspections, KDWP district fisheries biologist Jon Stein collected three zebra mussel adults. After the initial discovery, KDWP surveyed the lake shoreline in search of more mussels. Zebra mussels were found at many locations around the lake at very low densities.

“It’s unfortunate that these mussels have spread to another lake,” says Jason Goeckler aquatic nuisance species specialist for KDWP. “Zebra mussels reproduce rapidly. Once introduced, new populations can expand quickly and cause great damage both economically and environmentally. They can rapidly attach to and cover any hard structure in water, including native mussels, pipes, water supply structures, rocks, piers, flooded timber, boat hulls, and aquatic motor parts, often clogging them to the point of malfunction. Once zebra mussels become established, they are nearly impossible to eradicate.”

The zebra mussel is a fingernail-sized, D-shaped mollusk that typically has a dark and white (zebra-like) pattern on the shell. Since introduction into the United States in 1988, it has rapidly spread from the Great Lakes Region to Midwestern streams, El Dorado Reservoir in 2003, Winfield City Lake in 2006, and now Cheney Reservoir. Once zebra mussels were introduced in Kansas, a network of concerned parties was established. KDWP will work with the City of Wichita, Bureau of Reclamation, and others to ensure an effective management plan is followed.

“KDWP is currently working with the city of Wichita to mitigate the zebra mussel infestation,” says Goeckler. “Because this infestation is relatively new, well-informed management actions are necessary to ensure the zebra mussels are not further spread and that the affect to water users can be minimized.

That said, lake users need to be aware of the situation and take precautions when using Cheney Reservoir. It is against state and federal law to possess live zebra mussels, so all lake users need to ensure that they are not moving the mussels out of Cheney Reservoir.”

Zebra mussel larvae are free-floating and microscopic, which enables aquatic users to unknowingly transport them between water bodies. All Cheney Reservoir users must adhere to the following precautions to help prevent the spread of zebra mussels:

learn to identify aquatic nuisance species, such as zebra mussels;

never move fish or water from one body of water to another;

empty bait buckets on dry land, not into lakes;

inspect boats, trailers, skis, anchors, and all other equipment and remove any visible organisms and vegetation; and

wash equipment with hot (140 degree) water, a 10-percent chlorine and water solution, or dry for at least five days to remove or kill species that are not visible. Phone 620-342-0658 or email jasong@wp.state.ks.us if any nuisance species are found.




