## Board of Governors

Ninnescah Sailing Association  
Board of Governors - Minutes - April 3, 2008

BOG present: Pierce, Woodward, Knox, Carlsen, Shull, Hudson, Graves and Garvey.

Members/guests present: Carter, Shepard, Adams, Fremin, Cheatum and Leonard.

- The meeting convened at 7:00 pm.
- The minutes of the March 6th meeting were approved as published.
- Adams reported that the committee boat is in the water, the pump out station has been moved back to its summer location, the water will be turned on at the slips soon, the grills are being rebuilt as needed, the mowing contractor has been arranged for and the push mowers are being repaired for the season. The console cover on the committee boat needs to be replaced and we have the material and sewing machine at the club, we just need a person to construct it. Contact Patrick if you can assist.
- Jeff Leonard and Gary Cheatum presented their committee's revised lease. It was redrafted taking all members expressed concerns into consideration. The board approved the lease as presented with an amendment of winter season start date therein to conform to the date in the rules. The lease will be presented at a meeting of the members on a date to be determined and announced by Commodore Woodard.
- The financial report was presented, discussed and accepted.
- Carlsen advised the electric line replacement project would proceed upon approval by the appropriate officials. The mulch walkway on the southeast end of the Afterdeck will be converted to concrete when weather permits. He reminds members to not leave used oil or batteries at the club and to lock the gates.
- Knox discussed several options on mooring repair and replacement and advised the BOG that a diver was coming to



inspect the moorings on April 19. He also discussed work to be done on the crane, the progress on turning the slip boards and slip repair and maintenance items.

- Gary Shepard was present and addressed major repair needs required on C slip. The board discussed the need to get one members disabled boat out of the slip it is currently occupying so the lessee can put his boat therein.

- Garvey reported that the Easter event was a success and that the Memorial Day dinner is the next scheduled event. The yearbook is under construction, the website is being improved and will have a 'members' section with members information accessible only to the membership. The 'ship's store' committee is ordering new items and will be open at all events. The rapid hub is being revised so subgroups can be notified of committee meetings, work days etc.

- Pierce commended Vic Carter on the efforts he's making on Jr. Sailing projects. All regattas are scheduled and being worked on.

- Graves said the committee chairpersons meeting went well and thanked all committee chairs for their efforts and participation.

- Woodard advised the fire alarm system would be connected on April 15. He also reported that his day spent in Topeka with KWP staff and various legislators was a success. The KWP staff thanked the club for entertaining the State Park Directors present for their national convention last summer. The BOG discussed setting up another day of sailing with the KWP staff based on the positive response by the KWP staff to the event held in 2007.

- The Bruce's request for inclusion in the work credit program was approved.

- Adams discussed the fireworks for Sunday, August 31, Labor Day weekend.

- Knox reminded members of the club work day set for MAY 17.

- The meeting adjourned at 9:00pm

## ***GUST Sailing:***

GUST Sailing is a summer full of sailing fun. 3 clubs (Oklahoma City Boat Club, Windycrest Sailing Club, and Ninnescah Sailing Association) are hosting events that you can participate in and enjoy from May 31 to August 3. There are sailing camps, beginning racing clinics and CSSA regatta coaching. Mathias will be the Head Instructor at all of these events that are geared towards beginner and intermediate sailors and the sailors who just want to have fun!

The GUST sailing membership is \$300 for the entire summer. One fee pays for every camp, every clinic, and coaching at every CSSA regatta! Each sailor is eligible and encouraged to attend events at all clubs. ## ***GUST Racing Team:***

GUST has been so successful in training sailors in the past 2 years, many sailors now need more advanced opportunities. The GUST Racing Team is for those sailors who want to take the next step and sail in more competitive environments.

The GUST Racing Team will compete at the CSSA Jr. Regattas with the GUST Head Instructor, but they will also travel to compete at one or more regattas around the USA with specialty coaches. We are completing the final regatta schedule and will publish it on the CSSA Website soon! The Racing Team will also have specialty racing clinics that will address advanced racing techniques with racing experts!

The Racing Team fees are different than the regular GUST fees. Membership for the entire year costs only \$100. The 2008 membership fee covers all CSSA Regatta coaching from Mathias Laugesen (the GUST Head Instructor) AND reduces your fees when participating in each specialty clinic & out-of-area regatta coaching. Note: no GUST camps or clinics are included in this fee.

# NSA ARBORETUM PROGRESS

Thirty-five healthy, happy trees have been transplanted at the NSA facility at Cheney State Park Sailing Center. Weather conditions this winter delayed the project until just a couple of weeks ago, but much has been done:

An excavation contractor came in to remove our poor soil at each location and replace it with excellent topsoil. This dirt was conditioned with compost, and mounded up so the sites would recover faster in the case of high lake levels. Don Seiler from Andale transplanted 24 trees with his tree spade, and Chris Helten from Helten Gardens brought in the rest, "balled and burlapped".

An excellent crew from the NSA membership came out several days and shaped and mulched the berms, staked the trees, and installed "beaver wire". This was hard work and the volunteers did a great job: Rob Fresh, Danny Acridge, Vic Carter, Frank and "Trees-ah" Couch, Bruce Rowe, and Larry Schneidewind.

Several species of trees were planted, including River Birches, Bald Cypress, Autumn Blaze maples, Globe Willows, Swamp White Oaks, Redbuds, and Crab Apples. The trees were moved at the perfect time of year, and now they are settled in and starting to bud out. They are being watered with a tank trailer for now. Funds are being raised for an automatic drip watering system.

Most of the funding for this project has been provided by individuals. The NSA made a nice contribution to help with the extra excavation and dirt work. A few people have made very generous donations of several hundreds of dollars each. We all owe these folks our gratitude for improving our lovely Cheney State Park.

Those folks who donate \$300 or more are able to dedicate an individual tree. There will be a diagram and registry at the Afterdeck showing when and where each tree was planted, the species, who donated it, and to whom the tree is dedicated. It is hoped that funds will continue to come in to not only finish this phase of the Arboretum, but enable us to plant a few trees every year.
