January 10, 2008—Minutes

Present: Graves, Olsen, Cheatum, Couch, Gronniger, Knox, Gibson, Stump, Johnson and Woodward.

Meeting was called to order 2:00 pm.

- The minutes of the December 4, 2008 meeting were approved as published.

Property Managers Report:

- Adams reconfirmed the bag wall along with dirt work and landscaping all along the bag wall is needed and financially creative solutions are being considered. Patrick also reported that the high pressure washer located at the crane has been rebuilt. He also encourages boat owners to periodically come out and check on their boats during the winter. As minor adjustments to winterized boats can prevent costly repairs. Patrick would like to thank everyone who participated in the Holiday Parties both in the festivities and in the clean up.

Administrative Secretary Report:

- Johnson said annual dues are flowing in and all matters are in accord.

Commodore Report:

- Much of Graves report was the managing of discussion concerning the annual budget for fiscal year 2009. Which was approved with minor adjustments.

Commodore-Elect Report:

- Olsen reported that work committee chairperson assignments are progressing nicely. He also mentioned he has been approached by a Scout Troop from Goddard concerning sailing merit badges and he has shared contact information with Jr. Sailing for their oversight concerning this matter.

Past Commodore Report:

- Woodward announced that the Long Range Planning Committee is planning to meet. He also urges members to stay involved with the work credit program. Andy reported on the progress of the replacing/repairing of the outboard motor for the pontoon boat. Discussion was tabled for a future meeting chaired by the Vice Commodore.
